Membership

NTN represents and lobbies on behalf of members at local, regional and national events and shares information with members and partners. NTN provides representation on all major local and regional strategic/partner groups, such as the 14 -19 Strategic Board, the Nottinghamshire Economic Development Partnership, the Nottinghamshire Employment and Skills Board and Working Nottingham.

Employer Responsive Provision

NTN's Employer Responsive provision is focused on contract management of programmes under the European Social Fund and other funding streams, on behalf of our members. Contract management includes monitoring the quality of provision and support as needed. NTN has built on successful delivery of programmes such as Train to Gain, Response to Redundancy and others and is active in searching for and tendering for new funding streams.

The abolition of the Train to Gain funding scheme was announced in the Comprehensive Spending review on the 20th October 2010. With Train to Gain funding going, NTN will be focusing on becoming a lead contractor for local providers in delivering Adult Apprenticeships. NTN have already started the transition from Train to Gain to Apprenticeships by vireing a percentage of our Train to Gain contract into Apprenticeships for 10/11.

Apprenticeships are designed with the help of the employers in the industry, so they offer a structured programme that takes learners through the skills they need to do a job well. Apprenticeships are an excellent way of gaining qualifications and workplace experience. As an employee, learners can earn as they learn and you gain practical skills from the workplace.

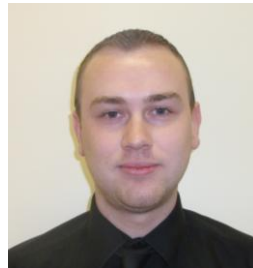
